- What are ways that a taxpayer can get help from the IRS? (Web site, videos, phone calls)
- 2. What is the closest IRS Taxpayer Assistance Center to where you live? (Answers will vary.)
- 3. What if I owe more than I can pay? (Set up a payment plan)
- 4. What happens if I just don't file? (Can face penalties and fines)
- 5. Let's say I wait tables after school. Are my tips taxable? (Yes)
- 6. What's the purpose of a W-4 form? (Set the correct amount of federal income tax to be withheld from your pay.)
- 7. How much is the standard deduction? (Depends on a variety of factors)
- 8. When should you itemize instead of claiming the standard deduction? (When you have more deductions than the standard deduction)
- 9. What are three itemized deductions I could claim now or in the near future. (Medical expenses, charitable contributions, mortgage interest, real property taxes, business expenses, etc.)



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- 10. What was the highest percentage income tax being paid in 1918? Why was it so high? (77% because of World War I expenses)
- 11. When did the IRS come into existence, and why? (July 1862 to help pay for the Civil War expenses)
