

ACTIVITY #2 ANSWERS Protecting Your Personal Information

Possible Answers Include:

Keep password concealed
Show it to your parents or guardian, but not your friends
Use abbreviations
Use numbers and letters
Be creative
Make it at least eight characters long

Some possible tips to include:

Be on guard
Know who you are dealing with
Do not rely on caller ID
Do not give out personal information
Ask questions

Some possible tips to include:

Log out of accounts

Keep security software updated

Do not share personal information over unsecured sites

Avoid using web sites where you have personal information saved

Use different passwords for different sites

Topic 3: Answering strange emails or providing personal information in an unsolicited email.

Some possible tips to include:

Do not email personal information or financial information Avoid opening attachments Report strange emails to your parents or the FTC Do not replay to strangers or strange emails Do not call phone numbers given in strange emails

Some possible tips to include:

Do not carry your Social Security card with you

Do not give your Social Security number to anyone you do not know

Ask why they need your number when it is requested

Do not post your Social Security Number on an unsecured web site
